

## **Memorial Pathway**





### **Senior Inter City League**

While the Inter Urban league, the competitive interclub competition made the decision to delay the resumption of competition for another year due to the lingering doubts over covid, the intrepid members of the Seniors' league decided to go ahead with their own after a two-year hiatus from competitive play.

The league which consists of four clubs, Rosedale Tennis club in Hamilton, Ancaster Tennis club,



Waterloo Tennis club and Port Dover have been contesting for the title of South Western Ontario senior tennis champions for the past eight years or so with the exception of the two years lost to the pandemic. For most of its short history, it had been mainly a battle between Rosedale and Waterloo for this title. The summer of 2022 was no different.

The regular league matches began Tuesday, June 7 (and thereafter played every Tuesday starting at 10 a.m to 12:15 p.m.) saw Waterloo going undefeated for the month of June, including a win against archrival Rosedale, the defending champion of 2019. However, heading into July the situation changed when Rosedale got the better of Waterloo in a second encounter which was to set a pattern for the rest of the season. Waterloo had a further setback in August due to a rare loss against Ancaster losing 11-13. The Waterloo team was without its top line of men and women that week. This served to put a little more distance between the two clubs but even then it was still possible for Waterloo to regain first place if it could manage a win against Rosedale in the final match of the regular season. Alas, It was not meant to be as the result again went Rosedale way 14-10, cementing them in first place with Waterloo second followed by Port Dover and Ancaster.

In the playoff rounds in late August, both Rosedale and Waterloo predictably won their matches against Ancaster and Port Dover respectively. This set up the Championship final played September 13 in Hamilton, a week later than scheduled, due to rain. Cool and wet conditions also prevailed on September 13 but this time Rosedale was prepared for the possibility and booked their indoor courts in advance. Under the dome were har-tru courts, a surface familiar to Waterloo. Whether this was a factor or not, the Waterloo team, very much the underdog, produced some of their best and spirited tennis. With a rare Waterloo win at no. 2 women doubles, (the Rosedale pair had been Waterloo's nemesis) the score after the first round was 6-2 to Waterloo and 10-6 after the second round. third and final round was the mixed doubles. Rosedale gained an additional 4 points while Waterloo gained 2 with one match, a nail-biting close one at that, yet to be completed. The score at this point was 12-10 to Waterloo which meant a loss by Waterloo would mean a tie for the title. In a tense tie-break, Waterloo's no. 1 pair of Chris and Suzanne Edwards did what they had done for most of the summer - they came up trumps. To borrow a line from one of the witty seniors, "The match was one for the aged." Next year 2023, the league will be welcoming Victoria Park. This addition is sure to shake things up.

We thank captain Rudy Gatzke for his time and efforts organising the team. Thanks also to all the members who stepped up willingly to assist with various new tasks. Everyone's efforts and dedication to the team contributed to the success of the season.

#### Men and women's tennis finish fourth at OUA Championship

Both the men's and women's tennis teams had strong showings at the 2022 OUA Championships hosted by York at the Mayfair Tennis Club.

In their opening round matchup, the men's squad cruised past the Brock Badgers by a score of 7-0 to secure their spot in the OUA semifinals against Western. On the women's side, it was much tighter competition, where it came down to the singles matches. *Savanna Cornfield (Vancouver)* earned a big victory in her match to give Waterloo a 4-3 win over the Badgers, punching their ticket to the semifinals against Western.

In the semifinals, Western, the eventual champions on both the men's and women's side, got the better of the Warriors, defeating the Warrior women by a score of 7-0 and Warrior men 6-1. The Warriors got their match win from <u>Alex</u> <u>Oancea</u> (*Thornhill*) who won his singles match in a thrilling 3-set win.

The loss put the Warriors in the OUA bronze medal match with the women facing off against McMaster and the men playing the host York for third place. The black and gold came up just short in those matches with the women losing 0-7 and the men 3-4 to settle for a pair of fourth place finishes.


